## FINANCIAL UPDATE

NMUMC is falling behind in our normal budget and building fund for meeting our financial needs to date for 2025. As a result, we are behind in paying our WV UMC Conference apportionments by \$15,796.64. Through May 31, 2025, expenses exceeded income by \$12,948.81, including unpaid Conference apportionments. May expenses exceeded income by \$8,662.16, including unpaid Conference apportionments. As funds are available, we will work on catching on the Conference apportionments. Our budget working balance is \$54,627.94.

As of May 31st, the 2025 Building Fund loan payments and expenses exceeded contributions for by \$2,504.55. May loan payments exceeded contributions by \$1,302.10. The building fund balance as of April 30, 2025, is \$51,697.57. The remaining balance of the Church loan as of May 31, 2025, is \$728,011.29. The payment schedule currently shows the loan will be paid in full May 10, 2034.

Capital projects to be paid from the Capital Fund balance of \$79,383.24

- 1. No.7 multi-purpose room air handler motor replacement \$3,992 motor is ordered.
- 2. Replace 2 fences behind the Church around the 2 sets of air conditioner units Lowes quote \$6,100 just received quote, Trustees voted to proceed with the contract.
- 3. Replace the sanctuary lighting controller. quote \$19,050 (new quote from Pittsburgh Stage \$59,678 but includes additional stage lighting). We are evaluating another quote.
- 4. Replace the multi-purpose room carpet. \$24,000 when the Church was built in 2005. Just starting to get quotes.
- 5. Replace the carpet in the preschool room in progress of getting quotes.
- 6. Seal the pavement in the parking lot and repaint the lines in progress of getting quotes one received for \$12,499.

Received a bottle of hand soap, a pair of shoes, and a toothbrush from Gifts of Grace contributions. Received a rocking chair from a family. Received 2 bottles of general purpose cleaner and a bottle of bleach from Gifts of Grace contributions. Received 4 bottles of laundry detergent and 2 sets of twin sheets from Gifts of Grace contributions. Received a case of toilet paper from Gifts of Grace contributions.
